Introduction

The purpose of the Community Asset Inventory is to provide a summary of the resources, assets and capacities available in Electoral Area A in order to provide a strong and positive foundation for future community economic development work. By identifying and locating assets and resources that already exist within Area A, we will be better able to find ways to use and build on these existing strengths.

The Community Asset Inventory for Area A was prepared in December 2012 by the Bridge River Economic Development Society with funding provided by the Squamish-Lillooet Regional District through a grant from the Northern Development Initiative Trust.

The data was obtained mainly through personal interviews and communication with the contact people provided in the inventory. Internet research was also a significant component in gathering the data.

The Community Asset Inventory is not intended to be static. Rather, it should be viewed as an evolving document that can be enhanced and updated as time goes on and as the area changes.

Area A has a small full-time population of 224 people. However, the recreational and part-time residents & visitors in Area A boost the area's population by double to triple at any given point.

Due to the small full-time population, amenities and facilities are limited in Area A. Most residents must travel outside Area A to receive full services and amenities. Hence, most buildings in the Bridge River Valley are multifunctional and are used for a variety of purposes.

Medical, Health and Wellness Services

Medical, Health and Wellness Services in Area A

Medical, Health and Wellness services in Area A are very limited. There are no medical facilities in Area A. Residents must go out of Area A for most medical, dental, health, and wellness services. A few services from Lillooet are provided in Gold Bridge on a once per month basis. There are two medical practitioners with the BC Ambulance Service. For more information on the services provided by the BC Ambulance Service please refer to Public Works on pages 9 & 10.

Doctor

Dr. Nancy Lynne Humber visits the Bridge River Valley occasionally. Currently, she is visiting and providing family physician services to Area A residents once a month. Dr. Humber sets up office at the Ambulance Station in Gold Bridge, BC. The Ambulance Station provides office space for Dr. Humber, as well as for the Public Health Nurse. The Ambulance Station is located at 40 Hurley Road, Gold Bridge, BC. Dr. Humber is regularly located at the Lillooet Medical Clinic in Lillooet, BC.

Public Health Nurse

Interior Public Health provides a Public Health Nurse to Area A through their Lillooet Branch Office. The Public Health Nurse is in Gold Bridge one day per month and sets up office in the Ambulance Station, where residents can pre-make appointments by calling 1-866-847-4327. The Public Health Nurse also visits the Gold Bridge Community School on a regular basis and does home visits as needed by the community.

Interior Public Health provides immunization for all ages, prenatal support, school education, and homes visits by the Public Health Nurse to the residents of Area A. Vision screening is offered once per year for the students at Gold Bridge Community School by Nadine Bennett from the Lillooet Branch Office. The current Public Health Nurse provided to Area A is Kim Davy.

Educational Facilities

Gold Bridge Community School

The Gold Bridge Community School is the only educational facility in Area A available for residents. The school hosts students from kindergarten to grade 7. After grade 7 students can choose to take distance learning/distributed learning until grade 10. After grade 10, students seek out schooling outside of Area A, often in Lillooet or Pemberton. The facility is also used for a parent-run preschool for ages 0 to 5 years two days per week.

Student enrolment over the past five years has been between 3 and 12 students. Currently there are 4 students enrolled at the Gold Bridge Community School. Predictions for the 2012 -2013 year are between 4 and 5 students.

The Gold Bridge Community School resides in School District 74 (Gold Trail) operating with an off-site principal, Jacquie Ledoux, and onsite head teacher, Jacquie Lanthier. The school has one large room with in school library use for classroom. There is a full kitchen with a staff desk and three bathrooms provided for staff and students. A secondary room in the back is used for storage and the parent-run preschool.

Outside of the building there is an uneven paved parking lot with picnic tables. There is a playground with two swings, tether ball, a cement slab for sidewalk chalk and hop scotch, monkey bars, and a jungle gum with slides. There is also a small field for student use. The field is in need of maintenance, as currently there are young trees poking up through the field and when it is not covered in snow, the field is full of weeds. The students still use the field and the head teacher ropes of the parts of the field that are over run with trees in the spring and summer. There is minimal impact on the activities of the students. If the field was maintained properly, then it would be used more by the residents of Area A for events and games.

According to the Action Plan for Learning 2011-2012 for the Gold Bridge Community School, student programs are delivered through distributed learning, home study, and class instruction. The students have access to many services, such as the Public Health Nurse that visits once a month. For more information on the Action Plan please refer to **Appendix A**. As well, there is Parent Advisory Committee that is very active and the students enjoy a lot of parental engagement as part of their learning plan. Lighting

The SLRD provides street lighting in both Bralorne and Gold Bridge. Residents pay for hydro, but not for the lighting infrastructure, which is owned by BC Hydro.

Sewer

The SLRD provides two separate sewer systems to Bralorne Townsites 1 & 2's residents. Each system drains into its own septic tank and is discharged into Cadwallader Creek. The Bralorne Gold Mine has its own septic systems.

Water

The SLRD provides services to residents living in Bralorne Townsites 1 & 2, as well as the Mineshaft Pub, the motels, the Bralorne Volunteer Fire Department, the Bralorne Pioneer Museum, and the Bralorne Gold Mine. The water system is a ground water system and is not chlorinated.

The water system in Gold Bridge is also a ground water system, which is chlorinated per Interior Health requirements. Water services are provided to the residents of Gold Bridge, the two hotels, Community Resource Building, works yard, Gold Bridge Community Complex, Gold Bridge Community School, and the general store.

Waste Management & Recycling

Gold Bridge Transfer Station

The Gold Bridge transfer station is open to residents of Area A for residential garbage and recycling. The transfer station is located on Saddle Road, in between Gold Bridge

and Gun Lake. There is also a free store at the transfer station for residents to pick up items and leave items.

Fire Protection

Bralorne Volunteer Fire Department

The Bralorne Volunteer Fire Department is funded by the Squamish-Lillooet Regional District and is operated under the Bralorne Volunteer Fire Department Society. Its jurisdiction is both town sites of Bralorne and the immediate surrounding area. The fire department relies on fire hydrants in town and an interface assist. There is one fire engine with a crew of 15 volunteers on call in case of a fire. Gun Lake Fire Protection Society

The Gun Lake Fire Protection Society (GLFPS) was founded in 1999 and it commits to educate, train and support the Area A community in fire prevention. For more information on the society, please refer to Community Organizations on page 34.

The GLFPS helps to protect properties on Gun Lake and the Little Gun Lake area; however, training will be provided for all of Area A residents.

IN CASE OF A FIRE:

The society makes sure to contact the Fire Service and let them know they are attending a fire and all possible information. The GLFPS are basically the first responders to fires. The society is not insured to fight structural fires; rather they are there to stop the fire from growing or spreading to other buildings. If the fire is large, then the Ministry of Forests will be out to work on it with whatever is required i.e. aircraft, manpower and equipment. The society would be working under their supervision if requested. The society has started a training program and putting together a two-year Training plan for all residents of Area A in to perform these procedures in case of a fire.

Public Works & Services provided by the RCMP

Law Enforcement & Search and Rescue

The RCMP from the Southeast District Lillooet Detachment provides both law enforcement services and search and rescue services to the residents of Area A. The detachment does not provide a routine presence of police in the Bridge River Valley. However, they do make scheduled patrols to the area. These patrols use police cruisers, quads, and the RCMP Air Section helicopter. Wildlife enforcement is conducted in Area A in late summer and fall by both RCMP and conservation officers. Bralorne and Gold Bridge were a part of the detachment's Marijuana eradication plan for 2012.

The Lillooet Detachment organizes search and rescue missions in Area A. The RCMP deploys and asks for assistance in emergency situations based on location resources and the quickest deployment of the resources. Tyax Wilderness Resort & Spa provides assistance to the RCMP by using their helicopter for search and rescue incidents. Also, Federal Fisheries have assisted in search and rescue efforts in Area A. The Lillooet RCMP also uses Lillooet Rescue for specific rope and steep embankment incidents. PEP and Pemberton Search and Rescue are often called in emergency situations in Area A. Other Public Works & Services in Area A

BC Ambulance Service

BC Ambulance Service provides 911 emergency services to the residents of Area A. There is one ambulance station located in Gold Bridge at the Gold Bridge Community Complex, which is owned by the SLRD. The station consists of one fully equipped ambulance, a staff office room

and a washroom. The ambulance station is not for public use, however, both Dr. Humber and the Public Health Nurse set up their office in the ambulance station when in Gold Bridge.

Area A receives 90% full time on call coverage of 911 services, with all the paramedics and drivers being on call, as the station is not a full time station. There are two paramedics and four drivers on call when the services are needed.

Gold Bridge Post Office

The Gold Bridge Post Office is a full-service post office, including general delivery pickup for residents of Area A. The post office is located in the Gold Bridge Community Complex in Gold Bridge. Residents of Bralorne have the option to have a Post Office Box in Bralorne beside the Bralorne Community Club or have general delivery as well. The post office drops off the mail for Bralorne residents who choose to have a PO Box, as well as picking up the mail from the drop off box beside the Bralorne Community Club.

There are specific instructions for the residents of Area A in terms of their general delivery system:

"Outgoing mail needs to be in by noon on Mondays & Thursdays; Mail arrives & leaves on Mondays & Thursdays; Mail is ready for pick up after 1:30 pm on Mondays & Thursdays depending on mail volume."

Gold Bridge Library

The Gold Bridge Library is part of the Lillooet Area Library Association, which operates libraries in Bridge River, Lillooet, and Gold Bridge. The Squamish-Lillooet Regional District and the Province of British Columbia Ministry of Education fund the library. The library is located in Gold Bridge at the Gold Bridge Community Complex. Services available to residents include a variety of materials for loan, such as books and movies, wireless high-speed Internet (mainly used for research) and lifelong learning programs and events.

Hydro

BC Hydro provides hydroelectricity to the residents of Area A, as well as operating a recreation area, Gun Creek Campground, on Carpenter Lake. For more information about the recreation area please see Recreational Facilities on page 17.

BC Hydro has two dams in Area A: Lajoie Dam on Downton Lake and Terzaghi on Carpenter Lake. These dams are a part of the Bridge River hydroelectric complex (system), which includes the Lillooet Dam on Seton Lake. There are four powerhouses and ten generating units (in both Area A & Area B) in the system.

45-50 employees are needed to maintain the system. There are also local employees in other departments of the system that are not accounted for in the number of employees. Roads

Public Roads

Public roads in Area A are serviced by Interior Roads. They provide road and bridge maintenance services in Area A. The only exception is for the Hurley Wilderness Forest Service Road;

responsibility from the 11km point on the Hurley to the turnoff to Bralorne (Hurley River Road) falls under Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure (MOTI).

The roads in Area A are all a mix of gravel, dirt, and paved surfaces. There is signage on public roads, bridges, and creeks.


Access

The Bridge River Valley is accessible from two roads, Road 40 and the Hurley Wilderness Forest Service Road (Hurley WFSR). For a map of the access roads please see the picture below.

Road 40 can be accessed via Lillooet by turning left at Moha Road and following Road 40 signs (Carpenter Lake Road) to Gold Bridge. Road 40 is also accessed from the Highline 4 x4 road through Seton Portage.

Road 40 is maintained year-round and is a mix of gravel and paved surfaces. Caution is to be used on this road at all times; watch for falling rocks and wildlife.

The Hurley WFSR can be accessed via Pemberton by heading north on Birch Avenue, which becomes Pemberton Meadow Road. Follow the sign that directs to Gold Bridge after 23 km on Pemberton Meadows Road. Cross a bridge

and a sign will say "Hurley River & Gold Bridge", take this road. The Hurley WFSR junctions off with one road directing to Bralorne (Hurley River Road) and one road directing to Gold Bridge.

The Hurley WFSR is only accessible during the summer and is considered a 4 x 4 road. Do not attempt to drive this route before reading the current driving conditions and be prepared for emergencies. For more information on the Hurley WFSR please visit www.isurvivedthehurley.com as this site updates road conditions on a regular basis.

The Bridge River Valley can also be accessed by floatplane and helicopter, as well as snowmobiles in winter months.

Bralorne Community Club

The Bralorne Community Club was the old gymnasium for students in the Bralorne High School before it closed down in the 1980s. Today it is used as a multifunctional hall for summer activities, such as weddings, recreational, and community events (plays and floor hockey). There are no set open hours, as the club is opened as per public request. The Bralorne Community Club is an old building that is in reasonable condition and useable in the summer, but currently has no heat for winter. Inside the 7620 square foot building features a large hall/gymnasium, an inset stage, wooden bleachers, and a functional kitchen. The square footage of the entire building is 7620 square feet. The Bralorne Community Advisory Committee from the Bridge River Valley Economic Development Society manages the club. Currently the committee is developing a management plan for the club, including rental fees and other management related issues. Community Resource Building

The Community Resource Building (CRB) is home to the Bridge River Valley Economic Development Society (BRVEDS), the Gold Bridge Tourist Information Booth, and Minto Communications Society. The CRB property is leased through School District 74 free of charge to BRVEDS. Historically, the building was the schoolteacher's house until it repurposed to become the Community Resource Building. It includes an office area, meeting room, computer room, bathroom, kitchen, and information room. The basement is used for storage.

The Gold Bridge Tourist Information Booth is run by BRVEDS. Minto Communications and BRVEDS have a partnership where Minto's services are run by a BRVEDS staff member for exchange of free Internet services for BRVEDS.

The services provided by BRVEDS for the residents of Area A and tourists include:

There are also several items for sale at BRVEDS including: stationary supplies, maps such as the Bridge River Valley Trail & Southern Chilcotin Trails Maps, postcards, photo cards, and a community directory.

The Tourist Information Booth provides visitor information about the Bridge River Valley, including free maps, brochures, flyers, driving directions, community directory, trail information and maps. A BRVEDS staff member is present to make sure all questions and inquiries are answered.

Minto Communications Society, via a BRVEDS staff member assists customers will bill paying, picking up and returning equipment, consultation, inquiries, and service calls.

Gold Bridge Community Club

The Gold Bridge Community Club (GBCC) is located on West Gun Lake Road in between Gold Bridge and Gun Lake. The GBCC is owned by the Gold Bridge Community Club Society, which looks after the club building and the golf course. For more information on the society please refer to Community Organizations on page 34.

The GBCC building includes a hall, which is used for weddings, Easter, Halloween, and Christmas events for families, bake sales, and other community events. The building also has a gym/workout room, full kitchen and bathrooms. The gym has no set hours of operation and is available 24 hours to gym members. Gym memberships are 1 year at \$100, monthly at \$10 and drops in are \$2.

The GBCC also has a golf course outside its front doors. The Bridge River Valley Community Golf Course has 9 holes and is operated by the GBCC Society. A membership for the golf course is \$50.00 per year for a single person and \$100.00 per year for a family. The society uses an honor box system for non-members.

Recreational Facilities

Camping

Recreation Sites

The recreation sites listed are those located in Area A. For more information and pictures of all the sites please see www.sitesandtrailsbc.ca. Unless otherwise indicated, the BC Ministry of Forests, Lands and Natural Resource Operations maintains all sites to standard.

Carol Lake

Carol Lake recreation site is located on the Marshall Lake Road about 2.3 km from the turn off on Road 40. There are 8 campsites available, which can be accessed by motorhome. Facilities include a boat launch, tables, toilets, and wharfs. Activities include: canoeing, fishing and nature study.

Driving Directions: Located north of Carpenter Lake, access is via Highway 40 from Lillooet. Travel 72 km from Lillooet until you see the Marshall Lake Road on the right hand side. Proceed up the Marshall Lake Road about 2.3 km. Turn right and proceed 1 km to the site.

Carpenter Lake Boat Launch

The Carpenter Lake Boat Launch site is located off of Road 40 and is a good resting spot, however, camping is not the main use of this site. There are 2 parking spots with one pit toilet. The boat launch is used by BC hydro for maintenance of the dam and is not for public use. Activities for this site include picnicking and vehicle accessible camping with tables.

Driving Directions: From Lillooet, travel north on the west side of the Fraser River. Travel along the Bridge River Road until reaching the intersection between the Yalakom River Forest Service Road and the Carpenter Lake Road. Staying straight ahead will lead you onto the Carpenter Lake Road. Travel along Carpenter Lake Road until reaching the Mission Dam. Turn left onto Shalath Road and cross over the dam. There is a short tunnel located at the end of the lake that passes through the hillside onto the south shore of Carpenter Lake. Travel a short distance further and you will find the small roadside recreation site on the left-hand side of the road.

Friburg

The Friburg site is located on the west side of Tyaughton Lake. There are 5 campsites available with picnic tables are motor home accessible. The site also has outhouses available. Activities at this recreation site include boating, fishing, horseback riding, snowmobiling, swimming, and mountain biking.

Driving Directions: The Friburg Recreation site is located on the western shore of Tyaughton Lake. From Gold Bridge proceed east along Highway 40 for about 15 minutes. You will pass the Gun Lake Recreation Site (run by BC Hydro). About 5 minutes past this site you will come to an intersection. This is called the Tyax Junction, and there are many signs promoting businesses etc in the area. Turn left onto this road (Tyaughton Lake Road). After approximately 2 km, you will pass the Mowson Pond recreation site. Continue on for approximately a 6 km. Watch for the Friburg Recreation Site sign on your right. A short access road

will take you to the main camping areas. You will end up at Tyax Lodge if you miss the turn-off to the campsite.

Gun Creek Hydro Site – BC Hydro Campground

The Gun Creek campground is located near Gun Creek off of Road 40, 8 km from Gold Bridge. The site is open all year but is only maintained from May to October by BC Hydro. There are 16 campsites accessible by vehicles and motorhomes. The site includes tables and pit toilets. Camping activities can be partaken at this site and when the Carpenter Reservoir levels are low, visitors can view the remains of the flooded town of Minto. Firewood is available for a small fee.

Driving Directions: Located north of Gold Bridge, access is via Carpenter Lake Road.

Gun Lake South

The Gun Lake recreation site is located on Gun Lake Road West, about half way down the lake. Facilities include 7 campsites, tables, and pit toilets. It is accessible by motorhome and vehicles. Activities include: fishing, swimming, nature study, mountain biking, and hiking.

Driving Directions: Access is via Gun Lake Road and then Gun Lake Road West

Kingdom Lake

The Kingdom Lake recreation site is located near Bralorne and is accessible by four-wheel drive vehicles only. There are 14 campsites with tables available and 2 outhouses. There are several lakes in the area with trails in between the lakes for hiking or mountain biking. Activities include: boating, camping, canoeing, fishing, hiking, mountain biking, horseback riding, picnicking, snowmobiling, swimming, and motorized trail bike riding. This site is user maintained.

Driving Directions: Accessible from Gold Bridge (to get to Gold Bridge use road 40 or the Hurley Wilderness Forest Service Road.) From Gold Bridge, follow the signs to Bralorne (11 km). Approximately half way, you will see signs for Kindgom Lake on the upper bank. Turn left up a short road.

Marshall Creek

The Marshall Creek recreation site is located north of Carpenter Lake on the south end of Marshall Lake near the outflow of Marshall Creek. There are 3 campsites at this location with a boat launch, tables, and pit toilets. Accessible by 2 wheel drive vehicles. Activities include: boating, camping, fishing, and nature study. This site is recommended for tenting only.

Driving Directions: Located north of Carpenter Lake. Proceed 72 kilometers west from Lillooet along Highway 40. Turn right at km 72 and go up the Marshall Lake Road until km 83. Turn left and go 1.4 km, then turn left on the Marshall Lake Road South. Follow this for a few hundred feet then turn right and it is 0.1 km to the site.

Marshall Lake North

Marshall Lake North recreation site is located on the north side of Marshall Lake off of Road 40. There are 6 campsites with a boat launch, tables, and pit toilets.

This site is accessible by 2 wheel drive vehicles. The site is popular for fishing, boating, camping, hunting, and swimming.

Driving Directions: Located north of Carpenter Lake. Proceed 72 km west along Highway 40 until you see the Marshal Lake Road North and turn right. Follow this road until km 89 (the road changes its name to the Mud creek main at 83 km). Turn a sharp left and follow this road for 1.0 km until you see the site, which has 5 tables. However, just before this site at about 0.75 km from the main road you can turn left and goes for a minute or so to get to the site with only 2 tables.

Mowson Pond

The Mowson Pond recreation site is located off of Tyaughton Lake Road. There are 6 campsites, tables, pit toilets, and a boat launch. The site is accessible by vehicles and by motorhomes. The site is popular for fishing, canoeing, boating, horseback riding, mountain biking, and snowmobiling.

Driving Directions: Located north of Gold Bridge, access is via Carpenter Lake Road and then Tyaughton Lake Road.

Mud Lake North

Mud Lake North is a four wheel drive accessible recreation site found off of the Mud Creek Forest Service Road off of Tyaughton Lake Road. There are 5 campsites including a boat launch, tables, and pit toilets. The site is mainly used for motorized trail biking trail purposes, four-wheel drive enthusiasts, and fishing.

Driving Directions: Access is via Tyaughton Lake Road and then Mud Creek Forest Service Road. The road is rough and narrow in places, and not recommended for 2-wheel drive vehicles.

Mud Lakes South

The Mud Lakes South recreation site is accessible through the Mud Creek Forest Service Road for four-wheel drive vehicles only. There are two campsites with a boat launch, tables, and pit toilets. The site is popular for its motorized trail uses and hunting.

Driving Directions: Access is via Tyaughton Lake Road and then Mud Creek Forest Service Road. The road is rough in places. Not recommended for 2 wheel drive vehicles.

Tyaughton Creek

The Tyaughton Creek recreation site is accessible off of Tyaughton Lake Road and then Mud Creek Forest Service Road. There are 4 campsites with tables and toilets. This site is accessible for 2 wheel drive vehicles. Activities include: camping, fishing, hunting, mountain biking, hiking, and horseback riding.

Driving Directions: Access is via Tyaughton Lake Road and then Mud Creek Forest Service Road.

Parks

Bridge River Delta Park

- The Bridge River Delta Park is a 992-hectare Class A provincial park located along the Bridge River and the Downton Reservoir. Please see Appendix E-1 for a map of the park.
- There are no amenities or facilities in this park as it is mainly intended for the protection of Grizzly Bears and their habitat.
- The management intent for this park is to remain a natural habitat for wildlife.
- Activities include: fishing, hunting, and hiking, however this is backcountry area, preferably used by experienced parties only.


Gwyneth Lake Provincial Park

- Gwyneth Lake Provincial Park is a 132-hectare Class A provincial park. The park
 is accessed from the Hurley Wilderness Forest Service Road. Please see
 Appendix E-2 for a map of the park.
- A campground is located on Gwyneth Lake with 6 campsites and a pit toilet; this is more like a forest service type campground.

- The management intent for this park is maintaining its rustic condition while increasing recreation usage.
- Activities include: fishing, hunting, and canoeing.

South Chilcotin Mountains Provincial Park

- The South Chilcotin Mountains Provincial Park is a visually spectacular 56,796 hectare park featuring mid elevation grasslands, sub alpine and alpine meadows, alpine lakes and mountain peaks. The park can be accessed at the Jewel Bridge trailhead, and through various logging and mining 4 x 4 roads. The park can also be accessed by floatplane or helicopter. The park prohibits off-road vehicle use. Please see **Appendix E-3** for a map of the park.
- There are approximately 6 designated walk-in backcountry wilderness campsites in the Park. The sites are at the North and South ends of Spruce Lake, Gun Creek Grassland, Hummingbird Lake, Trigger Lake, and Jewel Bridge. There are only facilities available at the Spruce Lake sites and at Jewel Bridge.
- Activities include: mountain biking, hiking, horseback riding, fishing, hunting, swimming, wildlife viewing, camping, and ski touring.
- Location & Access Information: This Park lies approximately 150 km north of Whistler and 95 km west of Lillooet. Access from Pemberton is via the Hurley Forest Service Road to Gold Bridge (this road climbs steeply to 1,850 meters and can be very rough) or from Lillooet along Carpenter Lake on Hwy 40.
 - To access the Jewel Bridge trailhead, take the Slim Creek FSR (about 7 km east of Gold Bridge on Hwy 40). The road heads generally north for approximately 12km to the start of the Gun Creek/Spruce Lake Trail at Jewel Creek. Alternatively, visitors can drive to Gun Lake and access this logging road at the east end of the lake. The park may also be accessed by the southeast and east sides via logging and mining roads. Many of these roads require a four-wheel drive vehicle.

Trail Networks

Trails in the South Chilcotin Mountains Provincial Park

There are over 200 km of trails in the South Chilcotin Mountains Provincial Park. The trails are mainly used for hiking, mountain biking, and horseback riding. Motorized vehicles are prohibited in certain areas of the Park. In the winter, ski touring, heli-skiing and snowmobiling take place. Many of the trails are well established, however, in some areas the trails may be difficult to see and there are un-bridged creek crossings. Commercial operators generally clear the trails of deadfall, but visitors may encounter deadfall from time to time. The trails in the park are far away from help, therefore visitors must be prepared with a first aid kit and should be aware that weather conditions can change quickly.

The multi-use trails have some general guidelines that should be followed: bikers yield to hikers & horses, hikers yield to horses and move off the trail downhill while horses pass, please stay on the designated trails, make noise to warn others, watch and respect wildlife, leave no trace, and please pack out what you pack in.

The main trails in the park are: Gun Creek Trail, Warner Pass Trail, Spruce Lake Main, High Trail, Tyaughton Creek Trail. There are many more trails; they are noted here per area within the South Chilcotin Mountains Provincial Park:

- Gun Creek Warner Lake Area: Gun Creek Trail, Warner Pass Trail, Lower Grasslands Trail, Wolverine Trail, and Leckie Creek Trail.
- Spruce Lake Area: Spruce Lake Main, Upper Grassland Trail, Gun Meadows Trail, Greasy Hill Trail, Open Heart Trail, Spruce Creek Trail, Viewpoint Trail, and WD Trail.
- Eldorado Valley Area: North Cinnabar Trail, B & F Creek Tail, High Trail, High Trail South Branch, and Camel Pass Trail.
- Tyaughton Creek Relay Creek Area: Deer Pass Trail, Purty Fair trail, Tyax Pass Trail, Relay Creek Trail, Lizard Creek Trail, Manson Creek Trail, Little Graveyard Trail, Lorna Pass Trail, Relay Col Trail, Little Paradise Trail, Castle Pass Trail, and Tyaughton Creek Trail.

The main trails are accessed through the trailhead locations that can be accessed by vehicle. The trailhead for Gun Creek Trail is at Jewel Creek Trailhead, which is accessed via Slim Creek Forest Service Road. Further up the road is the trailhead for the Slim Creek Trail. Trails of Area A (outside of South Chilcotin Mountains Provincial Park)

There are many more trails in the Bridge River Valley outside of the South Chilcotin Mountains Provincial Park. Many of the trails originated from First Nations people and were extended in use by those from the gold rush and by outfitters later on. Local residents and commercial operators have created new trails for activities such as mountain biking, hiking, and dirt biking.

The former Bridge River Valley Trails Society encapsulated the trails in an inventory with detailed information on trails in the Gun Lake, Bralorne, and Tyax area. They have also GPS'ed several of the trails and created maps for them. Please refer to **Appendix H** for the trail inventory with all the trails and their descriptions, allowed user groups, and signage. Recreation Activities & Terrain

Summer Activities:

Note: These activities listed below anyone can adventure out on one's own or they can book with one of the many Wilderness Adventure companies and outfitters in the Bridge River Valley. For information on the wilderness adventure companies please refer to Local Businesses on pages 49 & 50-53. See above for the information on the trail networks in Area A.

- Mountain Biking: The numerous trails in the Bridge River Valley offer unlimited mountain biking experiences. The network of trails offers world-class single-track trails in high alpine areas with spectacular scenery. Popular areas for mountain biking include the South Chilcotin Mountains Provincial Park, Bralorne, Gun Lake, and Tyaughton Lake areas. Another popular way to mountain bike is to be dropped off in the South Chilcotin Mountains by a floatplane/helicopter and bike out to the trailheads.
- Horseback Riding: There are many trails available for horseback riding adventures in the Bridge River Valley. Book a tour with one of the local outfitters or bring your own horse and ride. The most popular area for horseback riding is in the South Chilcotin Mountains Provincial Park.
- Hiking & Mountaineering: The numerous mountains and valleys provide endless hiking trails. Popular hiking trails are located in Taylor Basin and Spruce Lake and some popular mountains to climb are Mt Truax, Mt Fergusson, and Green Mountain. Another popular way to hike is to be dropped off in the South Chilcotin Mountains by a floatplane and hike back to the trailheads.
- 4x4 Roads & Trails: A popular activity in the Bridge River Valley is dirt biking, atving, and 4x4 driving on roads and trails. Popular areas for these activities are the Mud Lakes and Tyaughton Lake. Please note that motorized vehicles are not allowed on all trails.
- **Fishing:** The many lakes and streams in Area A provide great fishing opportunities. Popular places to fish in the Bridge River Valley include Pearson Pond, Mowson Pond, Kingdom Lakes, Little Gun Lake, and the Bridge River to name a few.

• Lake Activities: Swimming, canoeing, kayaking, boating, water, wake & board skiing, tubing, sailing, and windsurfing can be done on any of the numerous lakes in the Bridge River Valley.

Winter Activities

- Snowmobiling: Backcountry snowmobiling is popular in the Bridge River Valley. There are three main areas associated with snowmobiling in Area A: Bralorne, Slim Creek, and Taylor Basin. Many snowmobile trails are easily accessed through Bralorne, such as The East Hurley, Noel Valley, and Kingdom Lake FSR. Slim creek is the biggest area for sledding. Taylor Basin can be accessed through Tyaughton Lake. For more information on snowmobiling in the Bridge River Valley please visit the Bridge River Valley Snowmobile Club's website at www.brvsc.ca and visit www.sledbralorne.com for even more information!
- **Ski Touring:** A popular form of ski touring in the Bridge River Valley is snowmobiling to the backcountry to access alpine ski slopes. Close to Bralorne is Sunshine Mountain, which is a popular location for snowmobile skiing and snowboarding. There are several commercial operators that specialize in Ski Touring in the Bridge River Valley, such as Tyax Adventures in Taylor Basin and Whitecap Alpine in the McGillivray Pass area. - Heli Skiing & Boarding: Heli Skiing and snowboarding is another popular backcountry wilderness adventure in the Bridge River Valley. TLH Heliskiing and Blackcomb Aviation both provide heliskiing in Area A. For more information on these companies please refer to Local Businesses on pages 51-53.
- Cat Skiing & Boarding: Backcountry Snowcats provides Cat Skiing and Snowboarding on the Hurley Pass area in the Bridge River Valley. For more information on Backcountry Snowcats please refer to Local Businesses on page 51
- XC Ski & Snowshoeing, Ice Fishing, Hockey & Ice Skating, and Curling: These are more fun and adventurous activities that can be partaken in during the winter in the Bridge River Valley. Green Mountain Fire Lookout Cabin

 The Green Mountain Fire Lookout Cabin was the old forest service fire lookout, but it has not been used in several years. The cabin is located on Green Mountain and is now user-maintained. It is mainly used for warming and shelter.

Long Goat Cabin

 The Lone Goat Cabin is located off of the Hurley Wilderness Forest Service Road at the steel Bridge. The cabin is in good shape and has an outhouse as well. User maintained.

Sunshine Mountain Ski Cabin

• The Sunshine Mountain Ski Cabin is located near Bralorne on the historic Sunshine Mountain Ski Hill. The ski cabin is user maintained and used for warming and shelter. The Bralorne Community Advisory Committee is responsible for the cabin under the direction of the Bridge River Valley Economic Development Society (BRVEDS). There is a provincial government, draft tenure for the Sunshine Mountain Ski Hill, which includes the cabin. For more detailed information on the tenure please refer to Appendix I 1. In 2012, there was a volunteer effort to upgrade the cabin and to fundraise for further upgrading. For more information, please see the Volunteer Report in Appendix I 2. Taylor Basin Cabin

The Taylor Basin Cabin is an old prospector's cabin built in the early 1900's. The
cabin is rustic and is used for warming and shelter. The cabin is inside the South
Chilcotin Mountains Provincial Park, however, the cabin is user maintained. All
other cabins in the park are either owned by an outfitter or adventure company
and are locked up and not for public use.

Playing Fields

Bralorne Ball Diamond

The Bralorne Ball Diamond is the remnants of the old Bralorne High School's baseball field. The diamond is located at 100 Lorne St. in Bralorne. Please refer to **Appendix B** for a property map of the ball diamond (it is flagged in yellow). Currently, the diamond is open for community use and is maintained by the Bralorne Community Advisory Committee. There are no fees for use of the diamond. Facilities include the ball diamond, wooden bleachers, and a small concession stand. The Ball Diamond is host to the Bralorne Ball tournament. Bralorne Fire Hall Ice Rink

The Bralorne Volunteer Fire Department creates an outdoor ice rink beside its station every winter. The volunteers with the fire department maintain the ice rink throughout the winter. It is open for use for any resident of Area A and there are Wednesday Night Hockey games at 6 pm weekly. All are welcome. Historical & Cultural Facilities & Landmarks

The History of the Bridge River Valley

The Bridge River Valley has a rich mining history that is detailed in a variety of literature resources. The historical aspect of Area A can still be seen just by driving through the townsites of Gold Bridge and Bralorne, as many of the original mining buildings are still standing and a few of those have been restored. There are many landmarks that are identifiable to tourists and visitors, although many locals know of many more landmarks, which can also be researched in the literature. Over time, many of these landmarks, sites, and buildings will be torn down, weathered and decomposed or taken away. For the purpose of this project, the major historical facilities and landmarks are mentioned below.

Facilities

Bralorne Community Church

The Bralorne Community Church was built in 1936 as the Boultbee Memorial Church built by Bralorne Mines. The church held many services and weddings for many religions throughout the years until 1967 when services were ended. For a detailed account of the history of the church please refer to this link: http://www.bralornechurch.ca/history.html.

The Bralorne-Bridge River Community Church Society restored the Bralorne Community Church in 1999 and 2000. The church is the only remaining standing church in Area A. The restoration was funded through local businesses, private donors, BC Heritage Trust, the Squamish-Lillooet Regional District, and the Canada Millennium Partnership Program.

Today, the Bralorne-Bridge River Community Church Society opens the church per public request. There are no programs or services provided, but the facility can host weddings, funerals, meetings, dinners, dances, and sing-a-longs. The church holds a few community events in the summer in the basement. In the winter, there may or may not be heating depending on funds. The Bralorne Community Church is considered nondenominational and a heritage building. For a property map of the church, please see **Appendix B** (it is flagged in yellow). Bralorne Community Club

The Bralorne Community Club was built in the 1930s as the high school's gymnasium in Bralorne. Many community events were also held in the gymnasium as there was an inset stage used for theatre plays and pageants. The building still stands today and the kitchen has been restored and is used by the Community Club in Bralorne. For more information on the Bralorne Community Club please refer to Civic and Community Centers on page 13.

Bralorne - Pioneer Museum

The Bralorne - Pioneer Museum Society founded the Bralorne - Pioneer Museum in 1977. The museum has changed locations in Bralorne once and now resides in the old high school's shop building. The museum has a collection of mining artifacts from the historic mines, as well as many community life artifacts from the golden era of mining in the Bridge River Valley. The museum has over 10,000 artifacts including thousands of pictures and a library full of mining and community data. As well, there is detailed information on each artifact in the collection, which is invaluable. The Bralorne - Pioneer Museum is located on a lot owned by the society. On the property, there is a 100-meter boardwalk that display mining equipment used by the mines, a labyrinth, picnic areas, 2 outhouses, and a display of "Noah's Arks". Please refer to **Appendix J** for the property map. For a property map of the museum in relation to town site 2, please see **Appendix B** (it is flagged in yellow).

Currently the Bralorne - Pioneer Museum is open to the public during the late spring to early fall months, as there is no heating system in the building. The museum building itself is in poor condition and is not helping to keep the collection in good condition either. The society is looking to restore the collection to the best of its ability. Please refer to Urban Arts Architecture & Urban Design (604-683-5060) for a detailed examination of the museum's building and collection, which was funded by the Squamish-Lillooet Regional District.

Hours of Operation: Open Seasonally from May Long Weekend to Thanksgiving Long Weekend. Hours and days open vary year-to-year, usually open most weekends from 10 am to 4 pm.


Gold Bridge Model Bakery

The Gold Bridge Model Bakery still stands in Gold Bridge today, however it is currently privately owned. The bakery operated from 1934 to 1967 peaking in the 1950s. All types of bread and baked goods were produced during its time.

Bralorne Mine Site

The Bralorne Mine (now currently Bralorne Gold Mines) was the richest gold mine in North America during the depression in the

1930s. The mine eventually closed its doors in 1967, but reopened in 2011 due to unexplored mineral deposits and advanced technology. Mine tours are occasionally given on special occasions.

Pioneer Mine Site

The Pioneer Mine was part of the Bralorne Mines boom in the 1930s. Pioneer was a separate town just north of Bralorne. However, when the mine closed the town was destroyed. The very last remains of the mine can still be seen today at Pioneer.

Will Haylmore Historical Site

Will Haylmore was one of the original surveyors in the Bridge River Valley looking for gold. Will lived near Gold Bridge where he had his home, stage, workshop, and his own placer mine. The Bridge River Valley Economic Development Society has restored two of the buildings on the property. Currently, it is not available for viewing to the public.

Scenic Landscapes

 The Bridge River Valley is a vast mountainous region nestled between the Coast Mountains and the plateau zones in the interior Chilcotin region. The mountainous landscape hosts a myriad of peaks, ridges, and plateaus with old growth forests, alpine areas, meadows, and wild flower meadows. There are numerous lakes, rivers, creeks and streams in Area A.

There are many notable scenic areas such as the South Chilcotin Mountains in the South Chilcotin Mountains Provincial Park, the mountains (Mt Truax, Mt Penrose, Mt Sloan, Green Mountain, Mt Fergusson) that surround the picturesque lakes of Gun Lake, Tyaughton Lake, Carpenter & Downton Reservoirs, Kingdom Lakes, and many more.

The area is home to unique rocks and an abundance of wildlife including big horn sheep, grizzly bears, and beavers. Area A has endless scenic landscapes to view and explore via camping, adventuring out on the many backcountry trails, and to partake in the many wilderness activities available.

Glacial Features

 Alpine glaciers are common in Area A; they are easily recognized from the air in Area A's mountainous terrain. The biggest glacier in the area is the Lillooet Ice field, as it extends all the way to the Pacific Ocean Coastline. Climate/Weather

Area A falls in between the South Coast climatic area and the Interior/Cariboo-Chilcotin climatic areas of British Columbia. It is in between the rain shadow of the Coast Mountains and the central plateau of the interior. The climate is typically is colder, sunnier, and drier than the southern coast of British Columbia. Area A experiences the four seasons: fall, winter, spring, and summer. There is no historical data present for Area A according to Environment Canada. However, the climate in summer tends to be dry, sunny, and hot with temperatures reaching 30 degrees Celsius or higher, but dropping to freezing at night is not uncommon. Fall brings mild temperatures and snow usually arrives in October in the area. Winter is relatively cold, almost always below 0 degrees Celsius in the season. Spring, is usually mild and wet due to the melting snow.

Blackbird Creek Farm

Blackbird Creek Farm has 16 acres of land, most of which are bush and 3 acres are cleared for farming. Currently the farm is a small-scale producer of market organic vegetables. The farm also breeds Ameraucana chickens for egg production and Chanticleer chickens for meat production. In 2013, the farm will introduce of Nigerian Dwarf goats for dairy production and breeding.

Crop potential is humble, with cool-weather variety of vegetables doing best, including: potatoes, carrots, turnips, kale, lettuce, peas, broad beans, garlic etc.; cauliflower and broccoli in good years; beets and spinach when they are inclined to cooperate; and rhubarb. The farm has a new orchard that is maturing and will potentially yield apples, plums, and apricots. The farm also yields berries of many varieties.

The growing season is brief; planting in April or May when the ground is workable; harvesting August-September-October depending on the crop; after that, nothing is growing, but harvest can be extended into October/November with crop cover for personal use only.
